
As a Korean-British artist silversmith, William transposes his inspiration from oriental traditional philosophy into his hammered, innovative forms and surfaces. With regard to this he says:

'My design concept is inspired by the power of natural energy in nature, falling water, air movement, temperature. My invention is to express thegra energy of the inside, the power of nature, the change of fluid by gravity, not controllable by humans.'


